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1. Introduction

History of College

Katwa College was established on 1948 by a few acclaimed Social Leaders of Katwa. The College was started as an intermediate College with 140-150 students. Later, local people donated approx. Rs 32000/- to start the College building. In 1959, it received the status of a full-fledged Undergraduate College under UGC, initially affiliated to University of Calcutta, and later came under the affiliation to University of Burdwan on 16th of June 1960. Presently, offering co-education and three year under-graduate honours and general courses in Humanities Sciences and Commerce as well as one-year B-Ed courses; under NEP-2020 course structure, it runs 16 numbers of 4-year major courses, 3-year major courses 17 and 1 B.Ed. course. Now, College has one Girls' Hostel (Maitrayee) with a capacity of 52 boarders and one Boys Hostel bearing capacity of 85 boarders.

In the First Cycle of NAAC accreditation it scored with Grade B+ on 2007 and 2nd cycle of NAAC Accreditation it scored with Grade C on 2018.

Audit Committee

2. Objective & Scope of the Audit

Dr Nirmalendu Sarkar, Principal, in presence of other faculty members at a preliminary meeting, held on 10-08-2024 at 11.30 am, outlined the broad objectives of the academic audit and submitted the Compliance Report as well of previous audit. Accordingly, the audit team members decided to look into the prevailing situation at the College to assess the following aspects in course of the audit.

Scope

- Activities of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell
- · Functioning of IQAC towards institutionalization and internalization of quality enhancement in the institution
- Functioning of the Central Library and other activities
- Outreach Programmes conducted by the NSS and NCC units of the College
- Alumni and their contributions to the college
- Opportunities and scope of improvements in the major functional areas.

The team is empowered and expected to express their views and give suggestions for the improvement of the systems being followed by the College.

3. Methodology

Primarily, at the beginning a discussion was made with the Principal, Coordinator of IQAC and other faculty members& officials, which gave a general and broad profile of the facilities and activities of the College during 2023-'24.

Based on the report of the departmental profiles, information/data from the available documents and the interactions with few of the Heads/Coordinators relating to different components of the department/institution, the Audit Committee has made a sincere endeavour to put forward certain views, observations and recommendations and analysis of recommendations in the body of this report, will best serve the interest of the college as intended.

4. Distinctiveness of Institutional achievements

- 1. College runs three shifts of academic sessions during the session 2023-24.
- 2. College conducts regular science and arts exhibition to inspire the students in participatory learning.
- 3. College provide financial assistance to the faculty members to meet up the Registration Fee of Seminars/Conference to encourage the faculty members
- 4. Full-Time faculty members and SACT members are getting full academic support for continuing their research work.
- 5. College maintains greenery in and around the campus.
- College maintains Rose Garden, Fruit plants, *etc.*, within the campus and also motivates the students in campus cleaning programs and pollution free campus.
 Departments of Botany and Zoology are maintaining Biodiversity register.
- 7. Some of the best practices such as campus cleaning, maintaining tree plantation, floral biodiversity register, and introducing plastic free zone, No Smoking Zone, *etc.*, are followed in the campus.
- 8. College is taking care of disposing the wastes in and around the campus including hazardous chemical wastes through Katwa Municipality.
- 9. All teaching and non-teaching staff members, and students are aware about cleanliness and hygiene, water conservation *etc*.
- 10. College has one local Health facility centre ($\bar{A}rogya$) which serves the stakeholders as well as outsiders/common people.
- 11. Teachers are following CIA (Continuous Internal Assessment) effectively and monitoring the students accordingly.
- 12. Most of the departments are organizing seminar/ series of lectures/ webinars on regular basis to motivate the students.
- 13. College provides 50% required fund for conducting the International Seminar by the department(s).
- 14. Students of some of the departments are preparing wall Magazines on regular basis.
- 15. Some of the faculty members are publishing their research articles in UGC Care listed journals, book chapters having proper ISBN, conference proceedings, *etc*.
- 16. College has three units of NSS and one unit of NCC and are efficiently undertaking community services.
- 17. College is publishing one journal, 'International Journal of Social & Natural Sciences' and is progressing for UGC registration.
- 18. College provides Free WiFi facilities.
- 19. Sanitary vending machine has been installed in girls' common room and girls' hostel.

- 20. College has installed a solar panel of 6.7 kVA off-grid solar power system.
- 21. College participates in NIRF.
- 22. College follows a welfare system through Employees Co-operative Credit Society (Reg. No.: KT/1989).
- 23. College does not allow any cash transaction.
- 24. Carrier counselling committee conducts carrier counselling programmes and job campusing programmes on regular basis; Alumni also participated in the carrier counselling programme.
- 25. The College has a registered Alumni Association (Reg. No.: S/2L No. 62185 of 2016-17); a significant contribution has been made for infrastructure development of the College.
- 26. Students are benefitted through different scholarships like Kanyashree, Inspired, Swami Vivekananda merit-cum-means Scholarship, SC, ST, OBC, Minority, Jindal etc.

However, after detailed paper examinations and presentation by some of the departments as well as physical verification it is noted that, some of the academic practices are required to be followed by the College very seriously inconsonance with NAAC criteria. In addition, College has undergone through the earlier recommendations of the Audit Team and followed some of the practices as well.

5. Suggestions/ Observations:

- ✤ More access to e-journals is required.
- ✤ College should give more emphasis on job-oriented training courses.
- ↔ Overall pass percentage be improved.
- ✤ Number of faculty members of different department be engaged as board member of the university.
- ↓ The support staffs be given advanced training on e-governance.
- + The IQAC must explore the modern academic outlets following NEP 2020.
- ✤ Modernization of Classrooms for better teaching-learning be followed; Computer Laboratories and Science Laboratories be improved.
- ↓ College may proceed for Research Centre.
- ↓ Filling of permanent teachers against sanctioned posts be initiated.
